Dual Winners Handicap Snooker.

A New and Innovative Tournament format that came from Aaron Mahoney. Tournament was restricted to 32 entries only and was played in 1 day. Players eliminated from Main Comp then went to a Second Chance Comp. Prize money was equally divided between Main and Second Chance Comps. Approx \$500 prize money expected for each the Main and Second Chance Comps. Seeded players and semi/finalist CANNOT play in the Second Chance Comp. Where a non-seeded player departs the Main Comp, determines where they start in the Second Chance Comp. The Brunswick Club was the venue for the first Dual Winner Snooker Competition and seemed to be well received by the players. The Main tournament progressed in regular manner with all the seeded players progressing to the quarter final stages apart from Mark Bullen who was beaten by the fast improving Christian Walkerden. Steve and James Mifsud were both knocked out in the semi finals and a very close final was played between Daniel Thorp and Aaron Mahoney with Aaron coming out ahead in the end.

The Second Chance tournament was full of close matches between evenly matched opponents. After many hard fought wins it was Bernie and Sean Partridge, Boris Godina and Christian Walkerden that made it to the semi finals. Boris and Sean were the victors and played a quality grand final with Boris Godina being the winner. Boris lost his first match in the Main tournament so had to start from the first round in the Second Chance comp and win 6 matches in a row including the final which showed great spirit.

The Third tournament was a best of 3 black ball re-spot which provided some great entertainment. The matches were lightning fast and Joe Sacco proved to be the best by beating Dai Hebara in the final. Darren Didus and Peter Manafavis made it to the semi finals.
