Pennant A Grade Premier Snooker

With just 6 teams in the A grade competition and Yarravilles overseas recruit – Rob James the season promised to be a good one. Brunswick were the minor premiers and defeated Yarraville 10 – 3 in the first semi, to become odds on favourite for the flag. Yarraville then defeated Cheltenham 10 – 7 in a tough preliminary final. Yarraville then defeated Brunswick 10 – 9 in a much talked about grand final to win their second flag in a row.

Highlights – Rod Nelson high Break 120, Rob James won most frames with 40. Most Improved Player my vote goes to Daryl Tippett from Cheltenham.

Pennant B Grade Premier Snooker
